

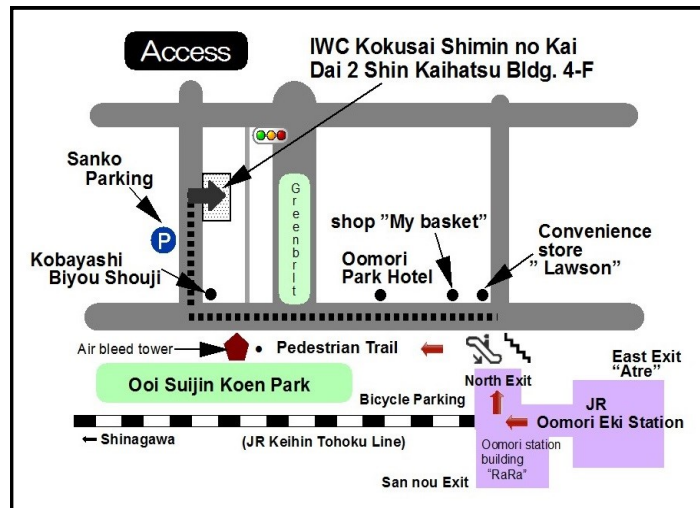

- From the JR keihintohoku Line" Omori Station", please exit From North Exit and walk along "Ooi Suijin Koen park" beside the train tracks; five minutes' walk towards Oomachi

- 1983 Established IWC Kokusai Fujin Club (International Women's Club), to support foreign residents in Minato-ku.
- 1989 Moved the base to Shinagawa-ku.
- 1990 Started JSL (Japanese as a Second Language) classes.
- 1993 Established IAC Kokusai Rikai no Kai. Started SSA. (School Study Assistance)
- 1994 Started the training course of teaching method of Japanese.
- 1995 Started CWN. (Children's World Network)
- 1998 JSL was commissioned by Shinagawa-ku Board of Education. IAC was united with IWC.
- 1999 Approved as the Non-Profit Organization IWC/IAC Kokusai Shimin no Kai.
- 2005 Renamed to IWC Kokosai Shimin no Kai.
- 2006 Started Preparatory Classes for High School Admission.
- 2009 Party to celebrate the 10th anniversary of NPO Foundation
- 2014 Issued a magazine in commemoration of the 15th anniversary of NPO Foundation
- 2015 The head office moved to Togoshi, Shinagawa-ku
- 2018 The head office moved to Minamiooi, Shinagawa-ku

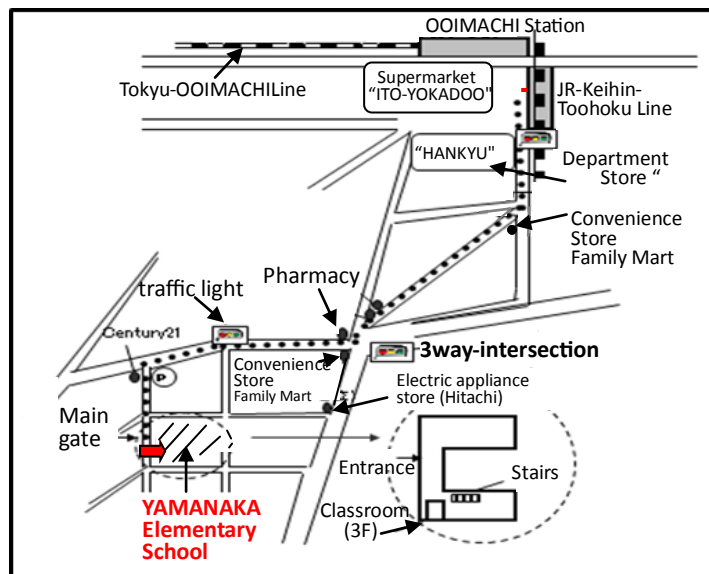

ACT 1 JAPANESE LANGUAGE PROGRAMS

1. Japanese Language For School Children

Qualification:

- Children attending elementary school or junior high school in Shinagawa-Ku.
- Children must be residents of Shinagawa-Ku.

1) JSL I (Japanese Intensive Course I) Commissioned by Shinagawa-Ku

This course is offered to children who cannot yet speak Japanese. Children will learn how to communicate with others and to fit into school life. 75 pull-out classes. Free of charge

2) JSL II (Japanese Intensive Course II) Commissioned by Shinagawa-Ku

This course is offered to children who need some help with their school studies. School textbooks will be used in class.

Children will learn how to study by themselves.

75 classes, after school. Free of charge.

3. Preparatory Classes for High School Admission

Students will study the subjects which are necessary for HS admission. We will give guidance and help students to find a HS which meets their wishes.



Qualification:

Foreigners over 15, who want to enter Japanese High School
Students must graduate junior high school (in any country).

When: Mon ~ Thur 10:00 ~ 15:00 (12:00 ~ 13:00 lunch break)

Where: IWC Main office

Fee: 40,000 yen / month (+ PTA fee 1,000 yen / month)

Subjects: Japanese, Grammar, Math, English, Science, Social Study, Essay Writing,
Pronunciation training, Interview training.
Guidance sessions will be also provided.

The contents will differ depending on the time of the year.

4. “Pre-preparatory classes for Japanese High School Admission”

This is an introductory class to learn the basics before the preparatory class. Students will first learn how to read and write HIRAGANA/ KATAKANA

Tuition: ¥16,000/month

PTA fee : ¥1,000 month

5. Japanese Teaching Introductory Course for People who want to Teach Japanese

10 weeks (30 hours). Lecture and practice work.
